



Prince George writer--and the Fed's North Regional representative--Lynda Williams works as an educational technologist and manager of a web development lab for web course development and teaches part-time in the computer science program at the University of Northern B.C. She has published in the area of social applications of computing, and appeared on the CBCs "First Person Singular." Her online e-journal "Reflections on Water" can be accessed at http://row.unbc.ca and she is Chair and production manager of the small University press UNBC Press.

But behind the academic credentials and mild-mannered demeanor is a truly creative writer. Lynda is the author of a science fictional thought experiment known as the Okal Rel Universe which has been part of her own personal "Second Life" since she was a high school science major. Incorporating her concerns about the responsible use of science in a world still driven by ageold desires for power and profit, the stories simultaneously unite contemporary anxieties with her love of heroes and larger-than-life mythology. The ten novel series of the main saga, published by Edge Science Fiction and Fantasy Publishing, chronicles the repercussions when the two major groups of humanity, bio-engineered humans and humanist egalitarians, collide again after a thousand-year separation.

Although the Okal Rel Universe is Lynda's brain child, first and foremost, it has always been a shared enterprise in one way or another and continues to manifest this quality now it is appearing in print. Some books of the main series, in particular, are co-authored with lifelong friend and fellow writer Alison Sinclair.


Since 2004, Lynda has also been acting as editor of works auxiliary to the main series that are set in the

Righteous Anger is the story of Horth Nersal, an aggressive alpha male type of character with exceptional talent as a reality skimming pilot and a fencer. His spatial genius is matched, however, with verbal limitations that make it particularly challenging for him to navigate family politics in a culture where disagreements end in fatal duels. Horth is also the soul of Okal Rel, the religious philosophy that demands all gains respect the need to leave behind a world into which souls can be safely reborn and demonizes the destruction of habitat.

Okal Rel Universe and published by the Fandom Press imprint of Windstorm Creative. Some of these, like novellas Kath and Mekan'stan written by Lynda herself, express the wealth of background stories that lie behind the ten novel series. Others, like the The Lorel Experiment (also by Lynda), branch out to fill in blanks across a thousand years of history, hundreds of worlds and dozens of cultures. The first anthology of stories set in the Okal Rel Universe came out in 2005, edited by Virginia O'Dine with contributors: Rick Hoggarth, Elizabeth Woods, Adam Volk, Sarah Trick and Amanda da Silva. The next edition of the anthology, edited by John Preet with cover art by Steve Swanson, is at the printers, with stories by Craig Bowlsby, Randy McCharles, Krysia Anderson, Patricia Crawford and Sandra FitzPatrick.

Righteous Anger

When I first read Righteous Anger, Lynda Williams's second novel in the Okal Rel universe, I wondered if the idea for the climactic scene originated with Toni Morrison's novel, and Oprah Winfrey's movie, Beloved. I had an opportunity to ask Ms. Williams that question at a recent reading. She replied, "No," her idea originated with the tragedy of Massada and the Jewish martyrs who felt their faith so deeply they faced death rather than capitulation and capture.

Righteous Anger, published by Edge Publications of Calgary, AB, is set against the greater inter-world conflict between the bioengineered super pilots, the Sevolites, based on Gelion, and the remnants of Earth culture, the dark skinned Reetions, based on Rire. Like the first novel in this series, Courtesan Prince, the foundations of the larger "racial" conflict is the renewed contact between the two disparate worlds after centuries of separation enforced after a devastating galactic conflict. In this first novel, the discovery of a long lost royal, Amel, who possesses the purest bloodline of the Sevolite empire, introduces the intricacies of intra-world politics between battling Houses built along almost "tribal" bloodlines.

And bloodlines are at the crux of the conflict in Righteous Anger. Within the Sevolite empire, the higher the percentage of "pure blood" and the ratio of Vrellish, or warrior, blood to Demish, or courtier, blood is of paramount importance. Chronicling the story of Horth of House Nersal (think a younger Worf, the Star Trek Klingon with a slimmer, but no less powerful build), Williams weaves a tale of hard won honor that proves even harder to hold. Son of Hangst, Liege Nersal, and his wife Beryl, product of a marriage arranged to bring truce between warring clans, Horth is witness to the ravages rained by racial xenophobia among and between the Sevolite Houses. Each of his parents represents one of the feuding factions; each hold biases and wears claustrophobic chains and blinders of each respective culture. Their internal conflict ultimately moves to the larger stage and threatens aggression on the larger, inter-galactic stage. And Horth stands on the threshold. Born to side with his father, called to the defense of his mother, he epitomizes Righteous Anger.

The world of Okal Rel ia a visually rich, politically driven, philosophically phrased, scientifically sound portrait of what could become of our wounded world. The genetic engineering and explosive ecological extinction we face in the early days of the 21st century lays the foundations for such a future. Lynda Williams is a writer with a universe in her head. I am so grateful she shares this treasure with her readers. I am eagerly awaiting the third installment, Pretenders, currently under production.

An inarticulate youth with a decidedly dark attitude and a quick sword hand, Sevolite Horth Nersal is the centerpiece of Lynda Williams' RIGHTEOUSANGER. The precocious youngster is a product of the Okal Rel Universe wherein our space-faring descendants clash long after Earth has become a fading memory.

Bred for space to near immortality, their caste status defined by genetic purity, feudal Sevolites war with the second wave of spacerstechnocentric, mixed-breed Reetions. At stake are the relatively rare, safe human habitats, both planets and space stations.

Horth is a product of a pact to end the conflict between The House of Nersal-Black Hearth (at court on the home planet, Gelion)-and their distant brethren, the Nesaks. His mother, Beryl, is a Nesak princess, his father the victorious Vrellish Gelack noble, Hangst Nersal, lord of Black Hearth and descendant of Nersal Nesak.

Growing up at court with his two older brothers, Zrenyl and Branst, Horth is considered defective due to his silence. But his skill at swordsmanship and his spatial proclivity overcome his lack of verbal prowess. Despite his passionate Vrellish heritage, most telling is his ability to discern and combat ignoble intent.

"Politics," said Horth, very carefully, "are dishonorable." (from page 130)

As Horth matures, he is given ample cause to develop the destructive side of his nature. Will anger, however righteous, bring about the downfall of his house? Or will he be able to balance his talents towards a more positive outcome, both for Sevolites and for their perceived Reetion

adversaries? Lynda Williams effectively displays the internal conflicts of Horth and her other major players, while providing readers with the visual feast of the Okal Rel in its starry splendor. Yet, her style reflects Horth's nature.

"He filled the Nesaks' nervecloth in a blue blaze of anger. Furious. Righteous. And unstoppable." (from page 189)

Here, Horth overshadows the series hero, Amel, whose fate so impinges that of Horth, his family, and all of Sevildom. He becomes a foil for Amel, who is an infant when Horth's own narrative begins. Pureblood Amel's being abused does not debase him because he passively draws from the light within his nature, whereas Horth rises above his detractors by thinking beyond his own good, and then taking action to bring it about.

Boggled by the convolution of her novel, I turned to Lynda for some insight. She says of her work, "Yes.I write complex books. Taking the graduate English courses has helped me to see that..I like to play with perspective, contrasting at least two points of view, and overlapping events to replay them from different standpoints."

expression, ack rel, which can mean anything from "let swords decide" to "tough luck," making it as ubiquitous as our present-day conversational phrase, "you know." Despite numerous unique, coined terms, whoever enjoys excellent use of the English language will be more than satisfied. And, although morally mature, the series is quite popular with the younger set, who can definitely identify with dilemmas faced by heroes like Horth.



When I really get into a book, so much so that I cry and laugh out loud, I start hoping for more pages. It doesn't matter how well the story at the length that it is. I will want more.

That is the way it was as I read Righteous Anger.

I am not good with names, so getting to

know the characters in a novel can often be a struggle for me, especially if there are a lot of people to keep track of. The first chapter of Righteous Anger had me worried, but the story pulled me right in. Lynda Williams creates amazing and wonderful worlds for her characters to live in. There is history and detail, but it doesn't overwhelm the story it compliments it. Every one of Lynda's characters seems to be an individual with their own reasons for doing what they do, which might be why it isn't a struggle to figure out who's who. There don't seem to be straw men or stereotypes. As I read Righteous Anger I felt like I was there with the main character, and that if I turned my head the world would be just as full and interesting down a different road or following another character.

Righteous Anger follows Horth, the third son of Hangst Nersal and Beryl Nesak. Through his growing pains and aspirations Horth attempts to be a good son, learning how to handle a sword, pilot a ship and navigate in space. He learns honour from those he believes to be honourable. Eventually he must follow his own beliefs when those around him fail to live up to theirs.

In the Okal Rel universe justice and honour are maintained by the sword. Just like the knights of old, the one that wins is considered to be right. But unlike the knights of old, these duellers are descendants of genetically improved humans. They are strong and agile, quick to heal, and emotionally vibrant. Fighting is meant to be one on one, rather than all out battles or wars. They have lost too many lives and even whole genetic lines in the past deputes, so the Okal Rel law of the sword is meant to limit such deaths. The law doesn't stop the intrigue, subterfuge, politicking, and hidden violence, but the desire to seem honourable allows the families/houses to function with some order.

Righteous Anger fits well with the other Okal Rel novels The Courtesan Prince, Part One and Throne Price, Part Four. I find myself hoping that part three of the Okal Rel series will be out in print soon, because I find myself desperately wanting more pages from Lynda Williams.

Okal Rel Saga FAQs.

There are two main cultures in your Okal Rel Saga series.

What are they, and how do they differ?



Lynda: The two big cultural divisions in the Okal Rel Saga are the Reetions and the Gelacks.

Reetions are a high tech, egalitarian society of natural humans descended from Earth colonists who rely on an extreme form of social transparency to keep each other honest.

Gelacks are neo-feudal, with their aristocrats drawn from a bioengineered race known as Sevolites who can breed with ordinary humans but are specially designed to be very good pilots. Sevolites are dominant over ordinary people in their society, and are obsessed with the superiority of their respective bloodlines.

Their piloting ability is critical because power, in the Okal Rel Universe, is tied to the method of faster than light travel called reality skimming.

What are some of the differences between the two cultures?

Lynda: Reetions are better organized and progressive, but Sevolites have this sort of super power that forces the Reetions to take them seriously. Neither culture respects the other. Reetions view the Gelack Empire as a sociological anachronism with nasty, barbaric tendencies and Sevolites view Reetions as a bunch of out-of-control commoners apt to screw up the universe with science that is ultimately anti-human and destructive.

In *Righteous Anger*, the main character, Horth Nersal, is the result of a treaty marriage between two warring Sevolite houses. When evidence suggests that the Reetions have somehow used technological mind contol techniques against the Sevolite "Pureblood" Prince Amel, the Sevolite factions are outraged, and Horth's father issues a call to arms to the splintered alliances to wage an attack of war against the "alien Reetions" in an act of *Righteous Anger*.


